Monsignor Title Goes To Rynish

The Rev. John J. Rynish, who has been pastor of Immaculate Conception Catholic Church since 1985, has been designated a monignor by Pope Paul VI. He was chosen as an honorary prelate in recognition of his services as temporary administrator of the Springfield-Cape Girardeau Diocese.

That was the period between the installation of the former bishop of the diocese, the Most Rev. Ignatius J. Strecker, as archbishop of the Diocese of Kansas City in Kansas, and the installing of Bishop William W. Baum as his successor here. After Archbishop Strecker's installation October, 1999, Father Rynish was elected as administrator by a priest-consultors of the diocese, serving until Bishop Baum was installed in St. Agnes Cathedral here last April.

The new monaignor has been dean of the Springfield Cape Girardeau Diocese for several years.

Orddined to the priesthood on Feb. 21, 1943, after graduation from Kenrick Seminary in St. Louis, Msgr. Rynish began pastoral work. Among his appointments he served St. Canera
