He was born in Montpelier, a son of Leon G. and Alma (Mathieu) Rouelle, and had attended St. Michael's College in Colchester, Vt., and the Seminaire de Philosophie and Grand Seminary in Montreal.

He was ordained in the Roman Catholic priesthood April 7, 1956, and had served several Vermont parishes, including St. Anthony's in Bethel from 1970-75 and St. Francis of Assisi in Windsor from 1962-65 and 1975-88. Survivors include three brothers, Albert Rouelle of New Britain, Conn., Francis Rouelle of Accomac, Va., and Leon Rouelle of Calais, Vt.; a sister, Katherine Thurber of Montpelier; and several nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by five brothers, Guy, James, Charles, Robert and Alfred.
