HIGH POINT — Reverend Father P. Patrick Gavigan, 81, died Sunday, March 4, 2007, at Pennybyrn at Maryfield, his residence for the past 11 years.

Locally he served as pastor at Our Lady of Grace and St. Benedict's Catholic Churches in Greensboro and at Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic Church in High Point. He then moved to Pennybyrn at Maryfield because of his Parkinson's Disease.

Surviving are his brother, Richard and sister-in-law, Claire Gavigan of Palatine, Illinois and many nieces and nephews.
