

Bishop Ordains Alumni April 3

On April 3, four priests, three of them Carroll alumni of the class of 1950, will be ordained by the Most Rev. Joseph M. Gilmore in St. Helena Cathedral. These candidates for Holy Orders are: Rev. Neil D. Chisholm, Rev. James J. Flynn, Rev. John J. Garrity and Rev. John J. Kerrigan.

Father Chisholm, born in Butte, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel A. Chisholm of 733 Ninth avenue, Helena. After attending St. Helena grade school and Cathedral High school, he was inducted into the army in 1943 and served with the Army Air Force bomber command in New Guinea, the Phillipines and Okinawa. After he completed his

service in the army, he attended Carroll College, where he was graduated in 1950, and completed his theological studies at St. Thomas Seminary in Denver, Colorado. He will celebrate his first Solemn Mass at 10:30 a.m., April 4, at St. Helena Cathedral.

Father Flynn, born in Amarillo, Texas, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph W. Flynn of 20 South Raleigh, Helena. He attended the parish parochial schools and Carroll College, where he was graduated in 1950. He took his theological work at the Catholic University of America and also did graduate work in education. He will celebrate his first Solemn Mass at 9 a.m., April 4, in St. Helena Cathedral.


Father Garrity, a native of Helena, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. William J.
