Besides his parents, Reverend Mr. Walters has one sister, Sister Ann Gregory who was to make her solemn profession in the Dominican Order of Marywood in Grand Rapids today. He also has two brothers, Gregory and Michael, both at home.

Reverend Mr. Walters was born in Detroit in 1937. After moving to Suttons Bay with his family in 1946 he attended St. Michael's school and Suttons Bay high school. Entering St. Joseph's Seminary in Grand Rapids in 1953, he completed his final two years of high school and the first two years of college. He then studied for two years at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, Maryland, receiving his B.A. degree in philosophy. He is presently completing his four years of theological training at St. John's Seminary in Plymouth, Michigan.

During the past three summers he was employed by Scenic Trails Council, B.S.A., as a counselor and acting Catholic chaplain at Camp Grallick.

As Reverend Father Walters he will celebrate his First Solemn Mass at St. Michael's Church in Suttons Bay on Sunday at 11:00 a.m. He will be assisted by Reverend Joseph Kohier of Traverse City, and Reverend Robert Matusowski of Gaylord. Several seminarians will also be present to assist him during the Mass. The Reverend Joseph C. McKinney of Mt. Pleasant will deliver the sermon. The pastor of St. Michael's, Reverend Charles D. Baker, will also be present.

A reception will be held from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. in the parish hall.
