Rev. Lowney To Talk on Retreat House

Rev. Emmett Lowney, director of St. Joseph retreat house, Deer Lodge, will speak on "The Christian Home, Children Yesterday and Today" Tuesday night at 7:30 and on Oct. 17 at the Knights of Columbus Dinner.

He was ordained in 1949, served as assistant to the late Rev. J. F. Schulte, St. Paul Parish; later was assistant to the Rev. Timothy Moroney, St. Peter; taught at Anaconda Central High School. He was graduated from Boys' Central, Butte, received his seminary training at St. Edward's, Seattle, his A.B. in philosophy and M.A. in educational psychology from St. Thomas Seminary, Denver.

He was transferred from St. Peter Parish to the Helena chancery office, was business manager of the Western Register, Pastor of Sacred Heart, Wolf Creek; director of Carroll College expansion fund; later Pastor of St. Catherine's, Boulder; chaplain at the state training school and for three years was Pastor of St. Michael's, Drummond. He has conducted retreats in Detroit, Lansing, Lake Orion, Redford, Rochester, Mich., Polson and Kalispell.

He also conducted closed retreats for women of the Diocese of Helena, and will give a retreat in Ottawa in 1968.
