

Shanley opens Tuesday with registration, 3 new administrators

Registration at Shanley High School, Fargo, will be held Tuesday, the first day of school. The anticipated enrollment is 560 and the students will be greeted by three new administrators.

Juniors and seniors are to meet in their home rooms at 8:05 a.m. Sophomores meet in their home rooms at 10:15 a.m. Freshmen meet in the auditorium at 9:30 a.m. for a welcome from the student council and to meet their big brothers or sisters. Following the welcome, freshmen will meet in their home rooms for registration.

New administrators include Christian Brother Cletus Joseph Rausch, chief administrator-principal; Christian Brother Roger Betzold, assistant principal for freshmen and sophomores; and Sister Rosaria Acton, assistant principal for academic program.

They replace Brother Michael Collins and Sid Cichy who were superintendent and assistant principal, respectively, last year. Rausch also was assistant principal last year.

Rausch, 42, was born in Mott, N.D., and grew up at Kensal, N.D. He received his bachelor's degree from St. John's University, Collegeville, Minn. He received his master's degree in education from St. Mary's College, Winona, Minn., and his education specialist degree (two years beyond master's program) in secondary administration from St. Thomas College, St. Paul.

He has taught Latin, religion, music and English the last 12 years including in Westchester, Ill.; Stevens Point, Wis.; Cretin Military High School, St. Paul; De La Salle High School, Minneapolis; and was a secondary principal at the public schools in Randolph, Minn.

position and sophomore boys religion the second semester.

Betzold, 29, is originally from Minneapolis. He received his bachelor's degree from St. Mary's College of Winona and his master's degree in secondary school administration from Loras College, Dubuque, Iowa. He has worked in Winona and most recently taught junior and senior high school in Dyersville, Iowa.

Betzold will teach Africa and sophomore boys religion and will drive bus on weekends.

Sister Rosaria was born in County Galway, Ireland. She is a sister of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose mother house is at Sacred Heart Convent, Fargo. She left Ireland 31 years ago after receiving her elementary and secondary education in that country.

She received her bachelor's degree from St. Teresa's College, Winona, and a master's degree in physical science at the Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C.

She taught for about five years at St. Mary's Elementary School, Fargo; taught science at Shanley for 14 years until 1970; and was the mother superior of the Sacred Heart Convent for seven years. Recently she has returned from a year's sabbatical at Gonzaga University, Spokane, Wash.

Greg Gregor will replace Brother Collins as music instructor and leader of the Sand Pebbles singing group.

Gregor also will teach English. He taught 13 years in Bismarck, N.D., public schools and five years in the Devils Lake, N.D., public school system.
