

Four Men To Be Ordained Permanent Deacons on Sept. 7

OMAHA — Four men will be ordained permanent deacons of the archdiocese Sunday, Sept. 7, at a 2 p.m. ceremony in St. Cecilia's Cathedral. The candidates are Charles Baughman, John M. Huck, David Janda and Duane N. Thome.

Bishop Maurice Dingman of Des Moines will preside in the place of Archbishop Daniel Sheehan who is recovering from a heart attack in a New York hospital.

A reception in the cathedral parish hall will follow the ceremony.

Charles ("Skip") Baughman, 33, son of Mary A. Baughman and the late Charles A. Baughman, Sr., is a native of St. Bernard's Parish and a graduate of North High. He married Barbara Hurt in 1967. The couple have three children: Charles III ("Chip"), 12; Cari, 9; and Micah, 4.

Since 1971 Baughman has served at St. Bernard's as a catechist, lector, special minister of the Eucharist, choir member and member of the Liturgy Committee (where he has helped plan communal Penance services and special liturgies). He currently serves on the parish council and is a facilitator for a Genesis II group.

He and Barbara organized and now su-

pervise a "coffee and donut shop" on Sunday mornings after Masses in order to encourage parishioners to get to know each other better. They serve on the advisory board for the junior and senior high youth ministry and have shared their faith with students in religion classes at Roncalli. They also work with engaged couples in the Creighton University "Growth for Couples" series.

John M. Huck, 42, is a native of Chicago. After graduating from the Illinois Institute of Technology with a bachelor of science degree in chemical engineering, he entered a career in the U.S. Air Force.

Huck and his wife, the former Beverly Anne Welsh of St. Clair Shores, MI, have five children — Elizabeth, Pamela, Matthew, Jennifer and Michael.

During his 20 years as an Air Force weather officer Huck was assigned at locations throughout the U.S. and overseas and acquired a master of science degree in geophysical sciences from the University of Chicago. He currently works as a systems analyst in data automation at the University of Nebraska Medical Center.

The Hucks have been members of St. Mary's Parish in Bellevue for five years.

Beverly is active in adult education and John is coordinator of lectors and Eucharistic ministers. Together they instruct parents of children about to be baptized, have a Bible study program in their home and belong to a charismatic prayer group.

Dave Janda, 38, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank J. Janda of Omaha, attended St. Patrick's Grade School and South High before serving in the Navy for five years. After returning home he married and had one child before deciding to finish his high school education.

He then entered the University of Nebraska at Omaha and later graduated from the Chicago Institute of Alcohol and Drug Addictions in 1975. He now is employed at Immanuel Medical Center as an alcoholism counselor, working with alcoholics and their families.

He and his wife, Josie, have been married 16 years and have two children, Dean, 15, and Mary Jo, 10. The Jandas for five years were members of Holy Family Parish where Dave served as a lector, minister of the Eucharist and president of the parish council. During this time he also worked with alcoholics at Francis House.

Josie is also active in the ministry to

alcoholics and has been a speaker in the Immanuel Hospital program. She is also a Eucharist minister. In 1979 the Jandas began working with engaged couples in the "Growth for Couples" series at Creighton U. They now are members of Sacred Heart Parish where they will be assisting in Marriage Preparation classes. They are also involved in charismatic renewal and Marriage Encounter.

Duane M. Thome, 33, was born and grew up on a farm in Schulte, KS. He graduated from St. Mary's University in San Antonio, TX, with a B.A. in 1969 and is a former member of a Marianist community.

Thome married Judy Rhye of Omaha. The couple has two sons, Glenn and Nick. They have been members of St. Bernard's and Ss. Peter and Paul parishes and now belong to St. Bernadette's.
