

The Rev. John Flanagan, from Jersey City family

The Rev. John L. Flanagan, 60, pastor of Our Lady of All Souls Church, East Orange, brother of Wm. J. Flanagan, executive director of the New Jersey Turnpike Authority, died yesterday at St. Mary's Hospital, Orange.

Born in Jersey City, Father Flanagan had attended St. Michael's Parochial and St. Michael's High School, Jersey City.

He attended Seton Hall University, South Orange, and took his religious studies at Darlington Seminary, Ramsey, where he was ordained a priest June 7, 1941.

His first assignment was at St. Bernard's Church, Plainfield. Father Flanagan served nine years as chaplain at St. Francis Community Health Center, Jersey City. For 17 years he was curate at Holy Trinity Church, Westfield.

At the time of his death, Father Flanagan was pastor of Our Lady of All Souls Church.

Besides performing his religious duties, Father Flanagan had also taught classes at St. Peter's Prep, and St. Francis Nursing School, both in Jersey City.

The wake for Father

Flanagan will be held this evening from 5 until 9 in the church rectory of Our Lady of All Souls Church.

Tomorrow at 3 p.m. Father Flanagan will be transferred in procession to the church where he will lie in state. A Bible Vigil services will be held at 8 p.m.

At 10:30 a.m. Saturday a Pontifical Mass will be offered at the church for Father Flanagan, followed by interment in Holy Name Cemetery, Jersey City.
