



Immaculate Conception Church, which will have its **100th anniversary** in 1983, will get a new pastor soon. He is **Rev. Alvin Pilie** who will be transferred here from West Palm Beach, Fla. He will succeed **Rev. Francis Renfroe**, who will go to **Paraguay** in late June for an important assignment for the **Society of Jesus**. Rev. Renfroe will help establish new Catholic churches on the Argentina-Brazil border where two new large hydroelectric dams will be built. He speaks Spanish but will have to learn the Indian dialect guarine. Rev. Renfroe has been very popular with his congregation which is one of the largest in the city. His forceful sermons have inspired his members a great deal. Before he became a priest 26 years ago, he was in the U.S. Navy for two years in the Middle East. Rev. Pilie was at Immaculate Conception for 10 years before he went to West Palm Beach a few years ago. Rev. Renfroe will leave in late June and Rev. Pilie will be installed here in August.
