The Rev. Art Cooney will speak at the 10th annual Catholic Charismatic Conference, April 9 at Green Bay Southwest High School.

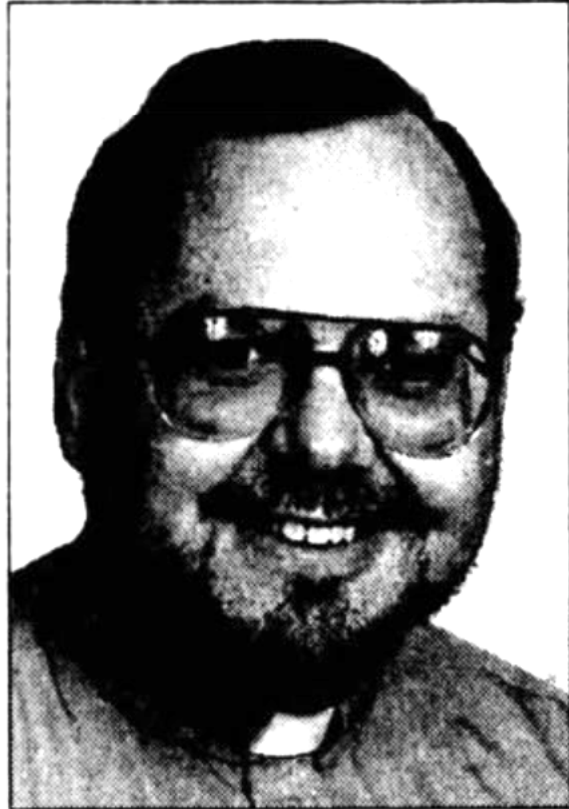
The Charismatic movement began in Green Bay about 20 years ago. The charismatic population has grown to an estimated three or four thousand.

Cooney works out of Saginaw, Mich., but spends much of his time preaching in Central America. During his presentation he will talk about personal adventures that range from being shot at during the Nicaraguan War to living on beans and rice.

Cooney is an advisor to the Renewal in North America and frequently speaks about inner healing.
