

Rev. Nellis Tremblay Plans For Ordination on June 12

The Rev. Nellis Tremblay, son of Mr. and Mrs. Francis G. Tremblay of this city, will be ordained to the Catholic priesthood Saturday, June 12, at 9 a.m. in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Albany by His Excellency, the Most Rev. Edmund F. Gibbons, D.D., Bishop of Albany. He will sing his first solemn high Mass in St. Alphonsus Church Sunday, June 13, at 11 a.m.

Born in Glens Falls Jan. 29, 1928, the Rev. Mr. Tremblay attended St. Alphonsus School, where he was a most brilliant and outstanding pupil, graduating in 1942. He excelled in Scout work and received the Ad Altari Dei Cross, the highest award the Catholic Church gives to Catholic Boy Scouts. He was the first Scout of St. Alphonsus Parish to attain this distinction. In addition, he was the first Boy Scout of St. Alphonsus Troop 7 to become an Eagle Scout.

After two years at Glens Falls High School, he entered St. Thomas Seminary, Hartford, Conn., after which he was accepted as a student for the Diocese of Albany. He remained in touch with Boy Scouting all during his studies for the priesthood and especially during the two years he spent at Paca Street Seminary of Philosophy in Baltimore and the four years of his theology course at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore. In both of these institutions, he helped with the formation of Boy Scouts and the teaching of Scouting to the young men who were studying for the priesthood.

At the solemn high Mass June 13 at 11 a.m., the Rev. Mr. Tremblay will be assisted by the Rev. Paul Leduc, pastor of St. Alphonsus Church, who will serve as assistant priest. Deacon will be the Rev. Leo L. Marcell, and subdeacon, the Rev. Joseph Gillon of Wilmington, Del. William Esmond will be master of ceremonies and Ernest Leroux will be in charge of the altar boys.

The sermon for this occasion will

be preached by the Rev. John Bazinet, S. S., of St. Mary's Seminary, Baltimore, Md., who was graduated from St. Mary's Seminary 25 years ago and, at the present time, is celebrating his 25th anniversary as a Catholic priest.
