

Father Soares To Lecture on India Seminary

Seminary conditions in India will be discussed Sunday afternoon at 3 by Rev. Protasio Soares, C.F.X. at 383 Spring Street.

Father Soares, in this country to enlist support for India's first seminary for the training of native clergy, reports that students there sleep on the floor for lack of beds and eat very scantily.

Government restrictions on foreign missionaries make it imperative to supply Indian priests, he explains, and for this reason the new seminary was founded.

Father Soares, who comes from Portuguese Goa, is in the United States for a year, and is assisting in parishes in the Fall River Diocese.
