

REV. M. J. CAMPBELL PRIEST 25 YEARS

LOCKPORT, May 29.—Back from Ireland, the land of his birth, where he visited his mother, brothers and sisters in County Donegal, the Rev. Michael J. Campbell will celebrate the 25th anniversary of his ordination Sunday at St. Anthony's Church, Bristol Ave., where he has been pastor 16 years.



Rev. M. Campbell Father Campbell will speak at masses at 6, 7, 9 and 11 o'clock Sunday morning. In the afternoon there will be a reception from 3 to 5 o'clock at the rectory, 270 Park Ave.

Born at Moness Burt, near Londonderry, and educated in St. Columbus College, the National University at Dublin and St. Peter's College, Wexford, where on May 29, 1921, he was ordained by Bishop William Codd.

Coming to America the same year, Father Campbell was appointed by the late Bishop Turner as assistant to the Rev. Daniel O'Brien at Nativity Church, Buffalo. In March 1924 he became the assistant rector of St. John's Church, Lockport, where he remained for seven years. He was appointed pastor of St. Anthony's Church by Bishop Turner on Dec. 7, 1930.
