

# **DIOCESE TO HEAR NEW PRIESTS SING MASSES ON SUNDAY**

Comprising the largest class in 25 years, 17 seminarians will be ordained priests by the Most Rev. John F. O'Hara, CSC, bishop of the Buffalo Diocese, at 10 o'clock Saturday morning in St. Joseph's Cathedral. Nine of the new priests are from Christ the King Seminary, St. Bonaventure College, and the others prepared for the priesthood at Our Lady of the Angels' Seminary, Niagara University.

All of the new priests except one, the Rev. Donald R. Paa, will be ordained for service in the Buffalo Diocese. Father Paa will be assigned to the Kansas City (Mo.) Diocese. Biographical sketches of the new priests and where they will celebrate their first masses follow:

## **REV. DONALD R. PAA**

A brother of Father Paa, the Rev. Joseph F. Paa, will assist him as archpriest at his first High Mass at 10:30 o'clock Sunday morning in St. Mary Magdalene's Church. Father Paa is 25 and his parents live at 159 Box Ave. He was born here. He was educated in St. Mary Magdalene Parochial School, the Little Seminary, St. Bonaventure College and Christ the King Seminary.
