

Siena Priest To Receive Sight Award

Rev. Eusebius Arundel, O.F.M., director of the Siena College Reading Center, will be recipient of the first annual Michailoff Vision Conservation Award at a meeting of the Eastern New York Optometric Society tomorrow at Jack's Restaurant, Albany.

Father Arundel, who has been at Siena since 1949, was ordained in 1946. He received his B.A. degree from St. Bonaventure in 1943. He did graduate work at Catholic University in Washington, D.C. He is director of reading guidance and an associate professor of education at Siena.

The award, named for the late Nicholas Michailoff, founder and first president of the Sight Conservation Society of Northeastern New York, recognizes Father Arundel for his accomplishments in the field of reading training and his activities in furthering inter-professional relationships between professions of eye care and education in the interest of the school child.

Dr. Abraham A. Hubal of Schenectady, vice president of the New York State Optometric Assn., will present the award.

Honored guests will include Rev. Edmund Christy, O.F.M., president of Siena College; Leo V. Stockman, district governor, Lions International, and Carroll W. Greenman, executive secretary. Sight Conservation Society of Northeastern New York.
