

To Celebrate Mass At St. Michael's



The reverend Clement M. Jarnot, a member of the Order of Friars Minor Conventual, will be ordained to the priesthood by His Eminence Lawrence Cardinal Shehan, D.D., at Saint Casimir Church, Baltimore, Maryland on June 17, 1965. Father Clement is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Chester J. Jarnot of 188 Warsaw Street, Lackawanna.

His elementary education was completed at St. Hyacinth School on Ridge Road, after which he attended St. Francis High School in Athol Springs. He then entered the Conventual Franciscan Order at Becket, Massachusetts, and after a year he pronounced his vows as a Franciscan on August

17, 1965. His college education was completed at Saint Hyacinth College, Granby, Massachusetts, where he graduated in 1961 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Philosophy. From the college he went to the Order's theological seminary of Saint Anthony-on-Hudson, Rensselaer, New York. Graduation studies during the summer months were also taken at Saint Bonaventure University, Olean, New York. For the past year, Father Clement has been teaching at Archbishop Curley High School, Baltimore, Maryland.

Father Clement's First Solemn Mass will be celebrated at St. Michael the Archangel Church on Warsaw Street at noon, June 20. The Pastor of St. Michael's, the Rev. Stanley Wisniewski, will be the Archpriest for the Mass. The Rev. David Stopryra, O.F.M. Conv., will be the Deacon, and the Rev. Ronald Sermak, O.F.M. Conv., the son of Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Sermak of 113 Lake Avenue, Blasdell, will be the Subdeacon. Both priests are teachers at Curley High. The preacher will be the Rev. Hugh De Cicco, O.F.M. Conv., the pastor of Saint Raphael Church, Burlington, Ontario.
