

St. Bernadette Chorus Will Give Concert

Mrs. Corby will open the program with the singing of the National Anthem accompanied by Marguerite Hunt. She also will accompany Mrs. La Barbera for "Cavatina" by Bohme and "Polish Dance" by Servern, and, in a violin duet with Louisa Kinaldi, for "Lucia" by Donizetti and Andantino by Lermare.

Annabella Ruggiero, accordionist, will play a group of Polish melodies.

St. Theresa's guest choir will sing "Bracia Mazur" by Nowowiejski and "Now the Day is Over" by Barnby.

St. Bernadette's Chorus will be heard in four groups opening with two Polish songs by Orlovski and Baranski. Its program also will include "In the Gloaming" by Harrison, "Old Black Joe" by Foster, "Home on the Range" by Krouse, "Ah Sweet Mystery of Life" by Herbert, "Indian Love Call" by Friml, "Lamplighter's Serenade" by Carmichael, "Say a Prayer for the Boys Over There" by McHugh, closing with Franz Schubert's "Ave Maria".
