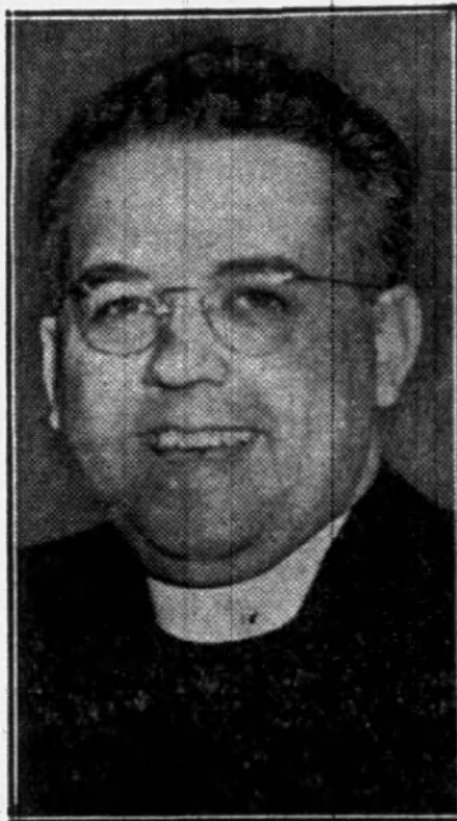

Local Priest Named Head Of Youth Bureau

Rev. Joseph Schieder Gets National Post

Washington, Feb. 12 (INS) — The Rev. Dr. Joseph E. Schieder of Buffalo, N. Y., tonight was named director of the Youth Department of the National Catholic Welfare Conference. He will assume his new duties March 1st, with headquarters here.

The appointment of Father Schieder, 39-year-old Buffalo native, was announced by Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston, chairman of the department.

Active Among Youths

Father Schieder now is director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine in Buffalo. He has served there as civilian director of the Youth Bureau, professor of adolescent psychology at Mt. St. Joseph's Teachers College, and director of the Chi-Rho Club, Buffalo's inter-high school Catholic Youth Club.

Ordained to the priesthood in 1935, Father Schieder long has been associated with various youth projects.

He has been chaplain and student adviser at Mt. St. Mary's Academy, Kenmore, and at St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute, Buffalo, and director of numerous youth retreats in his native city.

Serves on Committees

He has been prominently identified with the Tuberculosis Association of America, the Permanent Committee on Public Decency, Buffalo; the schools committee of the Council of Social Agencies of Erie County, N. Y., and the inter-faith committee for the more reverent observance of Good Friday.

Father Schieder is a graduate of St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute, Niagara University, St. Bonaventure Seminary and the University of Ottawa, where he earned the degree of doctor of philosophy.
