

CATHOLIC YOUTH DIRECTOR PLANS TALK IN TAMPA

The Rev. Joseph Schieder, youth director of the National Catholic Welfare Council at Washington, D. C., will speak at the Municipal Auditorium Friday night at 8:30 o'clock, it was announced yesterday.

Father Schieder will talk on *Our Children Are Our Tomorrow* and will tell his audience what it can do to make the children of today better men and women for the future.

After his talk, a student open forum will be held, with one student from each Tampa high school participating.

All persons interested in youth welfare are invited to attend.

Father Schieder has participated in many youth conventions, including the Midwestern Youth Convention held recently at St. Paul, Minn.

He returned from Europe in September, where he had spent several months visiting and taking part in youth activities. On his return from Europe, he made a report to the U. S. Government.

His talk here is sponsored by the Tampa chapter, National Catholic Woman's Club of which Mrs. Alice Bonk is president. A committee on arrangements is composed of Mrs. Milton Plumb, Mrs. H. O. Brown, C. C. Vega, Jr., Paul Straub and George Edmondson.

Father Schieder, who was born in Buffalo in September, 1908, and who was ordained to the priesthood in 1935, has been civilian director of the Youth Bureau of Buffalo, professor of adolescent psychology at Mount St. Mary's Teacher's College, and student adviser of St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute, Buffalo.

He also served as director of the Chi-Rho Club, Buffalo's inter-high school Catholic youth club; as chaplain and student advisor of Mount St. Mary's Academy, Kenmore, N. Y., and director of youth retreats for the Diocese of Buffalo.

In addition Father Schieder has been prominently identified with the work of the Tuberculosis Association of America, the permanent committee on public decency of Buffalo, the interfaith religious board of Buffalo, the Buffalo council of social agencies, the schools committee of the council of social agencies, Erie County, and the interfaith committee for the more reverent observance of Good Friday.
