Motorcycle Patrolman William K. Whelan is a man who believes in carrying out orders. Instructed by Commissioner Noeppel to clean up a one-mile "speedway" in Genesee St. between Bailey Ave. and the City Line, Patrolman Whelan diligently went to work.

On Wednesday he appeared in Traffic Court to press charges against 31 speeders and other violators, all issued summonses by him over a two-day period. The motorists were all flagged down in that stretch in Genesee St. where three persons lost their lives in traffic accidents last year. His haul is said to be the largest by a single policeman.
