Father Lehmkuhl Takes Final Vows In Jesuit Rite

WYCKOFF — The Rev. Charles W. Lehmkuhl, S. J., whose mother and sister reside in Wyckoff, took the final vows as a Jesuit in the Church of Saint Francis Xavier in New York today at 9:45 a.m.

It was a military mass attended by the Cadets of Xavier High School of New York. His mother, Mrs. Charles Lehmkuhl, and his sister, Howard Francis, live in Wyckoff at 310 Monroe Ave.

Born October 14, 1917, in Jersey City Father Lehmkuhl is the son of the late Charles Lehmkuhl and Florence Wagner Lehmkuhl. He attended St. Peter's Prep, Jersey City, and was graduated in 1936. He entered the Society of Jesus at St. Andrew on Hudson and made his first vows in 1938.

He served his juniorate at St. Andrew on Hudson 1938 to 1940. He took philosophy at Woodstock College, Woodstock, 1940 to 1943. He taught at Gonzaga, Washington, 1943 to 1946, science and mathematics and studied at Georgetown

University and Fordham University, Department of Biology. He took theology at Weston College, Weston, Mass.

He was ordained to the Sacred Priesthood at Weston College in 1949 after which he completed his theological course in 1950. He served Tertainship Pass Christian, Mississippi, 1950 to 1951. He gave closed retreats to high school and college students as chaplain at Charity Hospital, New Orleans and was preacher in Holy Name Church of Loyola University of the South, New Orleans. He was prefect of Discipline at Xavier High School, New York City, and moderator of the Regiment.
