

Rev. William G. Stanton Is Named Police Chaplain—

The Most Rev. Joseph A. Burke, D.D., bishop of Buffalo, yesterday announced the appointment of the Rev. William G. Stanton, assistant pastor of St. Joseph's Old Cathedral, as Catholic chaplain of the Buffalo Police Department. Father Stanton succeeds the Rev. Nelson W. Logal who last week was named pastor of Annunciation Church, Elma.

Father Stanton comes from a family of policemen. His father, John E. Stanton, has been a member of the Police Department for 33 years and has headed the Narcotics Bureau for nearly 18 years. Father Stanton's grandfather, the late Edward J. Stanton, spent 46 years as a patrolman in the First Precinct until his retirement in 1933.

Two uncles of the priest also are members of the Police Department. George M. Stanton, who has been a policeman for 25 years, is a detective in the Youth Bureau and Albert J. Stanton has been a patrolman in the South Park station since his appointment in 1948.

Father Stanton, who is 37, was ordained to the priesthood by the Most Rev. John F. O'Hara, C.S.C., former bishop of Buffalo, June 4, 1949. After spending a year in the missionary apostolate, he served as assistant pastor at Blessed Trin-

A graduate of St. Theresa's Parochial School and Canisius High School, Father Stanton studied at Our Lady of Angels Seminary at Niagara University.
