

Father Kinmartin Is Appointed Baker-Victory School Principal

**Father Baker High and
Our Lady of Victory
Combined to Make More
Efficient Space Use**

The Most Rev. Joseph A. Burke, bishop of the Buffalo Diocese, today announced the appointment of the Rev. Nelson J. Kinmartin as principal of the Baker-Victory Diocesan High School in Lackawanna for the coming school year.

The school is a combination of Father Baker High School, which had been operated by the Congregation of the Holy Cross, and Our Lady of Victory Academy. The schools were combined to make more efficient use of available space.

Father Kinmartin, the son of Mr. and Mrs. John J. Kinmartin of 13 Kermit Ave., formerly taught in Notre Dame High School in Batavia. A former student in St. Gerard's School, School 78, Bennett High School and Canisius College, Father Kinmartin prepared for the priesthood at Our Lady of the Angels Seminary and Niagara University. He was ordained June 3, 1950, and spent a year in mission service in the Diocese of Raleigh, N. C., before going into teaching.
