7 Will Be Ordained Priests In St. Joseph's Cathedral

Four Attended St. Bonaventure, Three Niagara; Bishop Burke Will Conduct the Ceremonies

Seven Buffalo-area young men will be ordained to the Catholic priesthood Feb. 25 in St. Joseph's Cathedral. The ordination ceremony will take place during a Solemn Pontifical Mass at 10 o'clock. The Most Rev. Joseph A. Burke, bishop, will be the ordaining prelate.

Four of the ordinands are from Christ the King Seminary at St. Bonaventure University; three are from the Seminary of Our Lady of Angels at Niagara University.

Officers of the Mass will include the Very Rev. Callistus Smith, OFM, rector of Christ the King Seminary, and the Very Rev. Walter F. Dirig, CM, rector of Our Lady of Angels Seminary.

REV. MR. CROWLEY
