

Rev. Joseph Stuart Roth Dies; Le Moyne College Ex-Professor

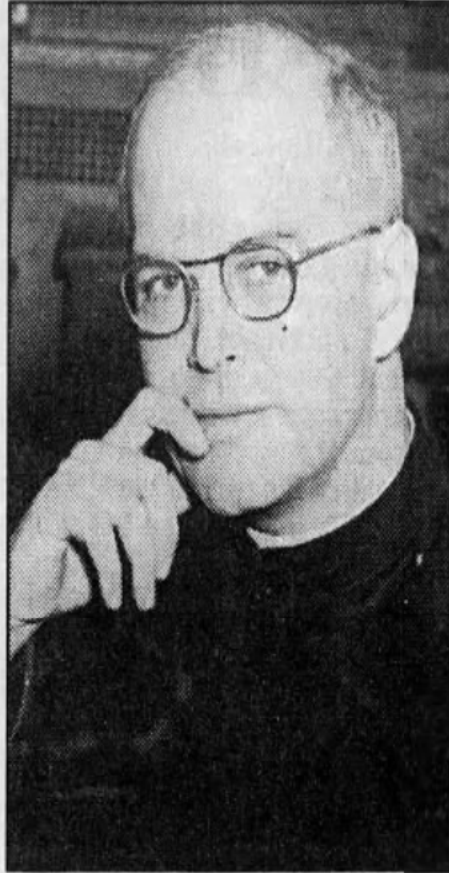
Services for the Rev. Joseph Stuart Roth, S.J., a former professor of philosophy at Le Moyne College who died Tuesday in the infirmary of the New York Province of the Society of Jesus, the Bronx, will be at 8 p.m. Saturday in Our Lady of Solace Church, Salt Springs Road, Syracuse. Burial will be in the Jesuit Cemetery at Our Lady of the Martyrs Shrine, Auriesville.

Calling hours will be 2 to 4 and 7 to 9 p.m. Friday and 2 to 4 p.m. Saturday in the Jesuit Residence Chapel at Loyola Hall on the campus of Le Moyne College.

Father Roth was a native of Syracuse, the son of Adelaide and G. Stuart Roth. He was a graduate of Most Holy Rosary High School and attended the College of the Holy Cross for two years before entering the Society of Jesus on July 30, 1935. Father Roth studied philosophy at Inisfada, Long Island, and received a licentiate in philosophy, a master's degree in education and a bachelor's degree in theology. He was ordained into the priesthood on June 22, 1947.

Father Roth taught mathematics and German at Xavier High School in New York City as a seminarian and, after his tertianship at Auriesville, taught philosophy, German and religion at Canisius College from 1949 to 1954.

Father Roth came to Le Moyne College in 1954, where he taught

philosophy until 1965, when he went to the University of Ottawa to earn his doctorate in philosophy. He returned to Canisius College in 1966 and remained there until 1981, when he became a priest in residence in the Jesuit Community at Le Moyne College.

Surviving are three brothers, Donald M. of Syracuse, Martin C. of Rochester and G. Stuart of Punta Gorda, Fla.
